STOKESLEY GOLF RANGE - LOCAL RULES

WATER HAZARDS

Rule 26-1 applies.

STONES IN BUNKERS

Stones in bunkers are movable obstructions (Rule 24-1 applies).

INTEGRAL PARTS OF THE COURSE

Paths are an integral part of the course, other than those bordered by a wooden or stone edging.

If the ball lies off the putting green but not in a hazard and is within two club-lengths of the intervening obstruction, it may be lifted, cleaned and dropped at the nearest point to where the ball lay which is:

- 1. is not nearer the hole, 2. avoids such intervention and
- 3. is not in a hazard or on a putting green.

PROTECTION OF YOUNG TREES

Protection of young trees, indentified by stakes. If such a tree interferes with a player's stance, or the area of their intended swing, the ball may be lifted, without penalty, and dropped in accordance with the procedure prescribed in Rule 24-2b(i) (immovable obstruction). The ball may be cleaned when so lifted. HEALTH AND SAFETY

Players should always ensure that their line of play is clear before proceeding. Where conflicts of play occur, e.g. where tees and greens are in close proximity to one another, it is a general principle that the match farthest round the course has priority of play.

PENALTY FOR BREACH OF ANY LOCAL RULES Match Play - Loss of Hole; Stroke Play - Two Strokes.
